

How do we transition between topics effectively?

You want to show how the two ideas in the paragraphs are linked. See this example for reference.

Weak Transition: The two paragraphs below reference **nursing** and **soldiering**. The transition here is not effective because neither sentence **mentions both nursing and soldiering**.

Weak Example:

In WWI, one of the most important roles that women performed was that of **nurse**. It was tiring work and extremely risky. They opened their doors and offered their services in **nursing** for free.

Some women became **soldiers**. Research suggests that some women, like Deborah Sampson, disguised themselves as men and joined the army; however, most were thrust into the role involuntarily (Ward 121).

Strong Transition: By referencing **nursing** and **soldiering** using a **common idea** (the war zone and risk to the women's lives), the transition becomes complete.

Strong Example:

In WWI, one of the most important roles that women performed was that of **nurse**. It was tiring work and extremely risky. They opened their doors and offered their services in **nursing** for free.

As if being a **nurse in a war zone was not risky enough**, some of the camp followers found themselves placed in the even more dangerous role of **soldier**. Research suggests that some women, like Deborah Sampson, disguised themselves as men and joined the army; however, most were thrust into the role involuntarily (Ward 121).

How much do we talk about the tweets of Silent Sam if we are talking about the nature of protests?

You will probably need 2 paragraphs to give yourself a good case study of what a specific protest movement looks like before talking about protests in general.

How do we get sources on a primarily underrepresented topic?

There should be enough articles at this point about Twitter and protests. You aren't going to get too many people talking about the exact same topic (silent sam and twitter), but you can pull from what people have written about other protests and what people have written about silent sam.

Will we get points take off for more than 6 slides?

No. You can use as many as you want. I just want a minimum number of slides.

Do we need to have they say or a quote in our introduction?

No, but it makes your set up feel more academic.

How quickly should you put they say in your paper?

As soon as you can, so your audience knows why you are arguing your point or writing this paper.

Are we including the Wolff review in the final at all?

Yes! If you want. You can use it in your "they say" portions of the paper.
